Panama vs Bonaire



Panama and Bonaire will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

The Panama national team will face a Caribbean opponent again following its 9-0 victory against the Turks & Caicos Islands in the 2025 edition on January 27, 2025, at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (DOM), in Group C of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase. The goals were scored by **Analía Arosemena, Kelly Zapata, Alison Ondera twice, Thelma Machado, Xianna Yee, Shaday Mow** twice, and **Stacy Montenegro**. That result became the largest victory for Panama in the history of the Qualifiers across all phases.

For the Bonaire national team, this will mark its debut in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, becoming the 35th nation to participate.



Bermuda vs St. Kitts & Nevis




Bermuda and St. Kitts & Nevis will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

The Bermuda national team enters this tournament and this match as the national team with the highest number of defeats in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, with 21 losses in 36 matches played.

For Bermuda, this will be the 26th time facing a Caribbean national team in the history of the Qualifiers. The team carries a run of five defeats in its last seven matches in any phase of the competition (L-5 W-2). The only victories in that span were a 4-1 win against Dominica on August 28, 2023, with goals by **Camryn Lines, Keyandae Lightbourne** three times, and **Avani Patton**, and a 5-1 victory against St. Vincent & the Grenadines on January 29, 2025, with goals from **Evans Welch, Milan Gibbons** twice, **Avani Patton**, and **Keyandae Lightbourne**.

In Preliminary Round matches specifically, this will be match #23 against a Caribbean national team, with a record of 10 wins, one draw, and 11 defeats.

For St. Kitts & Nevis, this will be the second time facing a Caribbean national team in any phase of the competition. The only previous record was a 3-1 victory against the British Virgin Islands on August 22, 2015, in Group 3 of Round One of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.



Suriname vs Panama

Suriname and Panama will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

Suriname will face a Central American national team for the first time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Panama, this will be the second time facing a Caribbean national team in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, following a 3-2 victory against Guyana on January 29, 2025, in Group C of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (DOM). Panama's goals were scored by **Shaday Mow, Isabella Rendino, and Yasselis Magallón**, while Guyana's goals were scored by **Avril Pasvolsky and Vernoica Chatta**.



Bonaire vs Bermuda

Bonaire and Bermuda will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

Bermuda will face a Caribbean national team for the fifth time in the Preliminary Round, having won all previous matches, scoring 23 goals and conceding only three:

2-1 vs. Anguilla (November 15, 2007, Group A)

6-1 vs. Curaçao (July 15, 2015, Group 2)

13-1 vs. Aruba (August 26, 2017, Group C)

2-0 vs. Cayman Islands (January 27, 2025, Group A), with goals by **Daley Outerbridge** twice

This will be the second time that the Bermuda national team faces Caribbean opponents in consecutive tournaments, after doing so in 2016 against Curaçao.

Bonaire vs St. Kitts & Nevis

Bonaire and St. Kitts & Nevis will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

St. Kitts & Nevis will face a Caribbean national team for only the second time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. The previous meeting was a 3-1 victory against the British Virgin Islands on August 22, 2015, in Round One, Group 3 of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase of the 2016 edition. Goals for St. Kitts & Nevis were scored by **Zynzelle Pemberton** twice and **Shaniqua Browne**, while **Katie Lowey** converted a penalty for the British Virgin Islands, at the Warner Park Sporting Complex in Basseterre (SKN).



Bermuda v Suriname

Bermuda and Suriname will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Suriname, this will be the second time in all its participations in the tournament that it faces a Caribbean national team, following a 3-1 victory against the U.S. Virgin Islands on October 21, 2021, in Group A of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase of the 2022 edition. The match was played at Field 1 of the IMG Academy in Bradenton (USA). Goals for Suriname were scored by **Samanie Loe-A-Foe**, **Shequeeni Felter**, and **Saveira Gallant** from the penalty spot, while **Azlyn Williams** scored for the U.S. Virgin Islands.



Suriname vs Bonaire

Suriname and Bonaire will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For the first time in all its participations in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, Suriname will face two Caribbean national teams in the same group (Bermuda and Bonaire), marking an unprecedented situation for the Surinamese national team.

In its eight previous matches in the tournament, five were against debuting national teams in the competition (62.5%). Bonaire will become the sixth debuting national team that Suriname faces in any phase of this tournament, with a record of two wins, one draw, and two defeats.

St. Kitts & Nevis



St. Kitts & Nevis and Panama will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

St. Kitts & Nevis will face a Central American national team for the third time in the history of the Qualifiers in any phase, following defeats of 10-0 against El Salvador on May 1, 2022, in the Round of 16 of the Final Tournament, and 4-0 against Nicaragua on January 28, 2025, in the Preliminary Round. Nicaragua's goals were scored by **Emma Quintanilla, Mariela Zavala, Stefany Miranda, and Helena Lau**.

Panama will face a Caribbean national team for the 10th time, holding a record of four victories, two draws, and three defeats. The most recent meeting was a 6-1 loss against Puerto Rico in the Championship on April 1, 2025, at Estadio Rommel Fernández in Panama City (PAN). Puerto Rico's goals were scored by **Giselle Falcón** twice, **Gabriella Garnett** three times, and **Camila Adame**, while **Paige Foye** scored for Panama.




St. Kitts & Nevis v Suriname



St. Kitts & Nevis and Suriname will meet again for the third time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, with each national team having recorded one victory.

In the first meeting, Suriname earned a 2-1 win in Group C of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase of the 2008 edition on February 15, 2007. That match marked the debut for both national teams in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

The most recent meeting was a 2-0 victory for St. Kitts & Nevis on October 22, 2021, in the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase of the 2022 edition, at Field 1 of the IMG Academy in Bradenton (USA), with goals by **Jahzara Claxton** and **Kionna Mills**.



Panama and Bermuda will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. Panama will be the third Central American national team that Bermuda faces in the history of the Qualifiers.

Panama will face two Caribbean national teams in the same group for the first time in any phase of the Qualifiers (Bonaire and Bermuda), an unprecedented situation in the history of the Panama national team in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Bermuda, this will be the third time facing a Central American national team in the history of the Qualifiers, following two defeats against Costa Rica (6-1 on June 8, 2018, and 9-1 on April 5, 2025). Costa Rica's goals in those matches were scored by **Lucía Paniagua**, **Daniela Ocampo** twice, **Tiara Ruiz**, **Nubia Medina** three times, an own goal by **Ayshalay Simons**, and **Michelle Murillo**.
