Panama 8–0 Bonaire



- For the first time in the history of the competition, Panama faced a debuting national team, earning its **18th all-time victory** in the tournament across all phases (**5 in the Final Round and 13 in Preliminary Rounds**).
- Panama recorded its **second-largest victory** in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, only behind the **9–0 win against Turks and Caicos Islands on Matchday 1 of Group C** in the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase on **January 27, 2025**, played at the **Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (Dominican Republic)**.
- Goals: **Analía Arosemena, Kelly Zapata, Alison Onodera (2), Thelma Machado, Xianna Yee, Shaday Mow (2), and Stacy Montenegro**.
- This marked Panama's **12th all-time match against Caribbean national teams** in the history of the Qualifiers, with a record of **seven victories**. It also represented Panama's **third Group Matchday 1 win**, following victories of **5–1 against Trinidad & Tobago on April 23, 2022**, and **9–0 against Turks and Caicos Islands on January 27, 2025**.
- **Cristabella Ríos (PAN)** scored her **first two goals** in the history of the tournament during the Preliminary Phase, recording her **first career brace**.
- **Allisson Samudio (PAN)** scored her **first-ever goal** in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, also in the Preliminary Phase.
- **Shaday Mow (PAN)** reached **eight goals** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, becoming Panama's **all-time leading scorer** in this phase of the tournament, and recorded her **second brace** at this stage.
- **Vera Batista (PAN)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.
- Panama played its **15th match** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers and extended its run to **five consecutive victories**, its **second-longest winning streak** in this phase, only behind the **eight straight wins** recorded between **2010 (2), 2012 (4), and 2018 (2)**.
- **Bonaire** became the **fourth national team** to suffer an **8–0 defeat** in its **historic debut match** in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, following **U.S. Virgin Islands vs. Jamaica (November 20, 2007)**, **Aruba vs. Jamaica (October 12, 2009)**, and **Belize vs. Guatemala (May 25, 2013)**.



Dominican Republic 7–0 Dominica



- The Dominican Republic reached **30 all-time matches played** in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers across all phases (**25 in the Preliminary Round and 5 in the Final Round**).

- This result marked the **third 7–0 victory** for the Dominican Republic in the history of the Qualifiers, following the **7–0 win against Aruba on October 16, 2009**, with goals by **Diana Taveres, Karina Adames (3), Yaqueisi Núñez, Anajaira Burgos, and Marielis Pérez**, and the **7–0 victory against Aruba on August 26, 2011**, with goals from **Anajaira Claudio (2), Lorena de la Rosa, Yessica Alcántara, Gabriela Peña (penalty), Yiraldy Reyes, and Donnevier Luitjes (own goal)**.

- It was the **sixth victory in eight “debut” matches** for the Dominican Republic in the history of the Qualifiers, also equaling its **largest margin of victory** in this type of match, previously achieved in the **7–0 win against Aruba on August 26, 2011**.

- **Dominica** recorded its **third consecutive defeat**, establishing its **worst losing streak** in the history of the tournament. Overall, the Caribbean side has lost **five of its last six matches** in the competition; its only victory during this run was a **2–1 win against the British Virgin Islands on August 26, 2015, in Matchday 3 of Group 3** of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase (Round One), played at **Warner Park Stadium in Basseterre (St. Kitts and Nevis)**.

- Dominica suffered its **fourth defeat in four “debut” matches** in the history of the tournament. In those matches, the team has yet to score a goal and has conceded **45 goals**, an average of **11.3 goals conceded per match**.

- **Caelyn Jiménez (DOM)** scored her **first two goals** in the history of the tournament during the Preliminary Phase, recording her **first brace** at this stage.

- **Blair Vera (DOM)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Phase of the tournament.

- **Giocarla Durán (DOM)** scored her **first two goals** in the history of the Preliminary Phase, registering her **first brace** at this stage.

- **Jabes Martínez (DOM)** scored her **third goal** in the Preliminary Phase of the Qualifiers, following the goal scored against **Grenada** in the **5–0 victory on January 28, 2025, in Matchday 1 of Group F**.



Bermuda 7–0 Suriname



- **Evans Welch (BER)** reached **four goals** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, after previously scoring against **St. Vincent & the Grenadines (January 29, 2025)** and **Puerto Rico (January 31, 2025)**. She also recorded her **first brace** at this stage of the tournament.

- **Milan Gibbons-Thomas (BER)** reached **six goals** scored in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers in the competition's history. It marked the **first time she scored four goals in a single match** at this stage; her previous goals came in a **brace against St. Vincent & the Grenadines on January 29, 2025**.

- With her **six goals**, **Milan Gibbons-Thomas** tied for **second place** among **Bermuda's all-time leading scorers** in the Preliminary Round, alongside **Jaden Masters**, who also scored **six goals** in the **2017 edition** (**1 vs. Saint Lucia, 2 vs. Antigua & Barbuda, and 3 vs. Aruba**).

- **Nadia Medeiros (BER)** scored her **first-ever goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.

- The **Bermuda national team** recorded its **second-largest victory** in the history of the Qualifiers, only behind the **13–1 win against Aruba on August 26, 2017**, in **Matchday 3 of Group C** of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase (Round One).

- Bermuda earned its **eighth victory in nine tournament "debut" matches** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, also registering its **largest margin of victory** in this type of match.

- **Suriname** equaled its **worst defeat** in the history of the Qualifiers, previously a **7–0 loss to Trinidad & Tobago on February 17, 2007**, in **Matchday 3 of Group C** of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.

- Suriname recorded its **second consecutive defeat in "debut" matches** in the history of the Qualifiers, marking the **first time** the team has suffered a negative streak in this category. It was also the **first occasion** in which Suriname went **two straight debut matches without scoring**, following a **2–0 loss to St. Kitts & Nevis on October 22, 2021**, and the **7–0 defeat against Bermuda on January 24, 2026**.



Trinidad & Tobago 2–2 Curaçao



- This marked the **third 2–2 draw** for **Trinidad & Tobago** in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers during the **Preliminary Round**, following draws **2–2 against Grenada on August 27, 2017**, and **2–2 versus Bermuda on October 16, 2017**.

- It was the **third meeting** between **Trinidad & Tobago and Curaçao** in the history of the Qualifiers in the Preliminary Round and the **first draw** between the two sides. The Trinidad & Tobago team remains **unbeaten in the series (2 wins, 1 draw)** and **conceded a goal to Curaçao for the first time** in the history of their matchups.

- **Jade Jones (TRI)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.

- **Sanni Wilson (TRI)** scored her **first goal** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.
- **Jacelynn Jubithana (CUW)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.
- **Xiarleahmay Martis Nocento (CUW)** reached **two goals** in the Preliminary Round of the tournament, after previously scoring against **Anguilla** on **Matchday 3 of Group D**, on **January 31, 2025**, in a match played at the **National Football Stadium in Managua, Nicaragua**.
- This was the **first-ever 2–2 draw** for **Curaçao** in the history of its Qualifiers appearances.
- **Curaçao** reached **20 matches played** in the history of the Qualifiers (**19 in the Preliminary Round and 1 in the Final Round**), holding an all-time record of **4 wins, 2 draws, and 14 losses**, with **21 goals scored and 91 goals conceded**.



Nicaragua 6–0 Belize



- The **Nicaragua national team** recorded its **second-largest victory** in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, only behind the **10–0 win against the U.S. Virgin Islands** on **August 29, 2023**, in **Matchday 3 of Group D** of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase. That match was played at the **Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (Dominican Republic)**, with goals scored by **Aneth López (3), Perla Garache (4), Emma Quintanilla, Jesneyling Méndez, and Verónica Navarrete**.
- **Stefany Miranda (NCA)** reached **five goals** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, following her goal against **St. Kitts & Nevis** on **January 28, 2025**, in **Matchday 1 of Group E**, played at the **National Football Stadium in Managua (Nicaragua)**.
- With her **four goals in a single match**, **Stefany Miranda** tied the **record for most goals scored in one match** for the Nicaragua national team, matching **Perla Garache**, who also scored **four goals against the U.S. Virgin Islands** on **August 29, 2023**, in **Matchday 3 of Group D**, at the **Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (Dominican Republic)**, all in the Preliminary Phase.
- With **five goals scored in the Preliminary Round**, **Stefany Miranda** became **Nicaragua's all-time leading scorer** in this phase of the tournament.
- **Maxie Teófilo (NCA)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.
- **Marian Ruíz (NCA)** scored her **first goal** in the history of the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers.
- This result marked only **Nicaragua's second victory against Central American national teams** in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, following the **2–1 win**

against El Salvador on June 1, 2013, in the second leg of **Tie 1** of the Central America Preliminary Phase (Final Phase).

- **Belize** suffered its **sixth defeat in six matches** against Central American teams in the history of the Qualifiers, with a record of **one goal scored and 47 goals conceded**, averaging **7.8 goals conceded per match**.
