



### **Guyana 0-0 Belize (Group A)**

Guyana extended its unbeaten streak to four matches and recorded its second consecutive goalless draw for the first time in history. The team has only managed two draws in 26 matches played. With this result, Guyana has now gone four consecutive games without conceding a goal, matching its previous record set in the 2012 edition with a clean sheet against Puerto Rico (1-0 win) and in the 2020 edition with shutouts against Bermuda (2-0 win), Antigua & Barbuda (2-0 win), and Saint Lucia (2-0 win).

Guyana has now gone two straight matches without a win or a goal against Central American opponents (L-1 D-1), marking its longest winless streak against teams from the region in tournament history.

Belize remains unbeaten in back-to-back matches in the competition (W-1 D-1) but has only won one of its last four tournament games (W-1 D-1 L-3). This was also Belize's first draw in its 12-game history in the tournament.

The 0-0 result marked the 17th goalless draw in Concacaf Women's Under-20 Championship qualifying history. Interestingly, Guyana was involved in the last two 0-0 draws in the competition—against the Dominican Republic on April 19, 2023, and now against Belize on February 21, 2025.

### **Haiti 3-1 Antigua & Barbuda (Group A)**

Haiti secured its sixth consecutive victory in opening matches of the Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers group stage. The win also marked Haiti's eighth victory in its last nine matches (W-8 L-1). The Haitians hadn't won an opening match since the 2018 edition when they dominated Saint Kitts & Nevis 12-0—seven years, two months, and 28 days ago.

This was Haiti's 33rd victory in tournament history and the first time they won by a 3-1 scoreline since defeating Cuba in the 2018 edition during Matchday 3 of Group A in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase—seven years, six months, and 26 days ago.

Haiti has now won nine of its last 14 matches (W-9 D-4 L-1), with the only loss in this stretch coming against the United States (6-0) in the quarterfinals of the 2022 edition on March 8, 2022.

Meanwhile, Antigua & Barbuda suffered its seventh consecutive defeat and recorded its 17th loss in the last 20 Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers matches. In its last 14 games, the team has only managed one victory—an 8-0 win over Bonaire in the 2018 edition in Haiti on July 23, 2017, during Matchday 3 of Group C in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.

Antigua & Barbuda has now played 25 matches in the tournament, with a record of six wins, one draw, and 18 losses, scoring 37 goals while conceding 76.

### **Panama 2-0 Cuba (Group C)**

Panama ended a three-game losing streak and a run of three consecutive matches conceding goals. This was Panama's third-ever 2-0 victory in tournament history, following wins against Honduras on May 31, 2004, Costa Rica on August 6, 2015, and now Cuba on February 21, 2025.

Panama secured its second win in as many meetings against Cuba in the tournament. Their previous victory came in the 2012 edition with a 2-1 result in the Final Phase, Group B Matchday 1 on March 2, 2012. In that match, Ángela Evans (16') and Marta Cox (54') found the net for Panama, while Rachel Peláez (27') scored for Cuba.

This was Panama's 10th matchup against a Caribbean opponent in tournament history, earning its fifth victory along with three draws and two losses.

Cuba, meanwhile, has recorded two wins and two losses in its last four tournament matches. The defeat against Panama was Cuba's 25th all-time in the competition and its eighth meeting against a Central American team, suffering its seventh defeat and third straight loss. The only Cuban victory over a Central American side came in a commanding 6-1 win against Honduras on February 24, 2020, in Group C's Matchday 2 of the 2020 Concacaf Women's Under-20 Championship Final Phase.

This was also Cuba's second consecutive defeat in an opening match of the Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers group stage and its third loss in 10 opening games (L-3 W-7). Cuba's last opening match victory came in the 2018 edition when they defeated Dominica 10-0 on July 19, 2017.

### **Canada 22-0 Dominica (Group E)**

**Canada secured the second-largest victory in Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers history.** The biggest win remains the Dominican Republic's 25-0 triumph over the British Virgin Islands in the 2006 edition in Mexico on September 23, 2005, during Matchday 2 of Group D in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.

With the 22-0 win, Canada joined the Dominican Republic (25-0 in 2005) and Jamaica (21-0 in 2001) as the only teams in tournament history to score 20 or more goals in a single match.

Canada also notched back-to-back wins in the competition and recorded its 43rd victory in tournament history.

Meanwhile, Dominica extended its winless streak in the tournament to 10 matches (L-9 D-1) and suffered its fourth consecutive defeat. Dominica's last victory in the competition was a 3-1 win over Saint Vincent & the Grenadines in the 2014 edition in the Cayman Islands on July 18, 2013.

### **Dominican Republic 8-0 Bonaire (Group C)**

The Dominican Republic secured back-to-back wins in the tournament and recorded its second-ever 8-0 victory. The first came against the U.S. Virgin Islands in the 2006 edition in Mexico, during

Matchday 1 of Group D in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase on September 21, 2005.

This was the 20th clean sheet in the Dominican Republic's tournament history and the sixth time they have kept a shutout against a team from an overseas territory.

The Dominican Republic also claimed its second consecutive victory in an opening group-stage match of the Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers, extending its unbeaten streak in such matches against teams from overseas territories (W-2 D-1).

Meanwhile, Bonaire suffered its fourth consecutive defeat in the competition, having lost all of its tournament matches. This was also the second time Bonaire conceded eight goals in a single game, previously falling 8-0 to Antigua & Barbuda in the 2018 edition in Haiti on July 23, 2017, during Matchday 3 of Group C in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.

This was the second meeting between Bonaire and the Dominican Republic, with Bonaire suffering its second loss. The two teams last faced each other in the 2018 edition on July 21, 2017, during Matchday 2 of Group C in the First Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.

### **Trinidad & Tobago 3-0 Bermuda (Group E)**

Trinidad & Tobago secured its third victory in its last four matches in the competition and recorded its fourth-ever 3-0 win. The team previously achieved this scoreline against the Dominican Republic and Anguilla in 2013 and against the Cayman Islands in 2023.

This was Trinidad & Tobago's 11th win in 11 matches against teams from overseas territories in tournament history. Impressively, they have kept a clean sheet in nine of those encounters.

It was also the 28th clean sheet for Trinidad & Tobago in tournament history and the eighth time they have recorded a shutout in an opening group-stage match of the Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers.

Meanwhile, Bermuda suffered its fourth defeat in its last five matches (W-1 L-4). This was the 13th time Bermuda faced a Caribbean opponent, marking its eighth loss and the first time it has fallen by a 3-0 scoreline.

Bermuda also suffered its second consecutive defeat in an opening group-stage match of the Concacaf Women's Under-20 Qualifiers, adding to its tally of three losses in its last five opening matches in tournament history.
