Cuba vs Grenada

Cuba and Grenada will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Cuba, this will be its 12th match against a Caribbean national team in the history of the tournament in the Preliminary Round, with a record of four victories, one draw, and six defeats. The most recent appearance in the Qualifiers ended in a 6-0 loss to Haiti on August 29, 2023, in Group B of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (DOM). Haiti's goals were scored by **Dalanchy Pierre**, braces from **Lourdjina Etienne** and **Pierreline Nazon**, and a strike by **Derline Saindate**.

For Grenada, this will be its ninth match against Caribbean national teams in the history of the Qualifiers, holding a record of one win, two draws, and five defeats. The only victory in that span was a 2-0 win against St. Kitts & Nevis on February 17, 2007, in Group C of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase. Since that match, Grenada has gone on an eight-match winless run (L-6 D-2).



Costa Rica vs British Virgin Islands

Costa Rica and the British Virgin Islands will meet for the first time in the Preliminary Round of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Costa Rica, this will be the fourth time facing a Caribbean national team in the history of the Qualifiers, having won all three previous matches in the Final Phase of the tournament, scoring 22 goals and conceding only two, with an average of 7.3 goals per match.

Results

7-0 vs. Cayman Islands (March 10, 2010)

6-1 vs. Bermuda (June 8, 2018)

9-1 vs. Bermuda (April 5, 2025). Costa Rica's goals were scored by **Lucía Paniagua**, **Daniela Ocampo** twice, **Tiara Ruiz**, **Nubia Medina** three times, an own goal by **Ayshalay Simons**, and **Michelle Murillo**, while **Janiya Sealey** scored for Bermuda.

For the British Virgin Islands, this will be the first time facing a Central American national team in the history of the Qualifiers. The British Virgin Islands, along with St. Vincent & the Grenadines, are the only national teams to have lost all of their matches played (6/6). Among the teams that have never won a match prior to the start of the tournament, the British Virgin Islands hold the record for the most losses. The Turks & Caicos Islands also played six matches but managed to record one draw.



British Virgin Islands vs Cuba

The British Virgin Islands and Cuba will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

The British Virgin Islands will face a Caribbean opponent for the sixth time in the history of the tournament. The team has lost all five previous matches against Caribbean sides, conceding 46 goals and scoring only two (0.4 goals per match). The most recent meeting ended in a 2-1 loss against Dominica on August 26, 2015.

For Cuba, this will be the fourth meeting against Caribbean opponents, having won all three previous matches with clean sheets and 12 goals scored. In its most recent appearance in the Qualifiers, Cuba earned a 5-0 victory against the Turks & Caicos Islands on January 29, 2025, with goals by Sunehri Borego twice, both from the penalty spot, **Marianelis Reyes** twice, and **Yaiselis López**.




Anguilla vs Costa Rica

Anguilla and Costa Rica will cross paths for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Anguilla, this will be its fourth match against a Central American national team. The team has lost all three previous encounters, failing to score and conceding 26 goals. In its most recent meeting, Anguilla suffered a 5-0 defeat against Guatemala on January 29, 2025, in Group D of the Preliminary Round at Estadio Nacional de Fútbol de Managua (NCA). Guatemala's goals were scored by **Linda Galindo**, an own goal by **Keanna Vanterpool**, **Emily Moreno**, an own goal by **Reynah Lico**, and **Victoria Godoy**.

Costa Rica will share a group with two Caribbean national teams (the British Virgin Islands and Anguilla) for the first time in the history of the tournament in the Preliminary Round.

Previously, Costa Rica faced Caribbean opponents in the Championship Phase but had never shared the same group with them.



Cuba vs Anguilla

It will be a first-ever meeting in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers between Cuba and Anguilla.

For Cuba, this will be the first time in the history of the tournament, in any phase, that it shares a group with two Caribbean national teams. It will also mark the second time Cuba faces two Caribbean opponents in the same edition, after defeating the Cayman Islands 6-0 on July 15, 2015, and Bermuda 1-0 on November 13, 2015, in the 2016 edition.

Anguilla will face a Caribbean national team for the fifth time in the history of the Qualifiers. The team has recorded three defeats and one draw, a 1-1 result against The Bahamas in the 2018 edition on August 23, 2017, in Group B of Round One of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase, at Estadio Juan Ramón Loubriel in Bayamón (PUR).



British Virgin Islands vs Grenada

The British Virgin Islands and Grenada will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Grenada, this will be its fourth meeting against a Caribbean national team in the Preliminary Round of the Qualifiers, having recorded two consecutive victories, a 6-2 win against Curaçao on August 23, 2017, and a 9-0 victory against the U.S. Virgin Islands on August 25, 2017, while also suffering a 2-0 loss to Bermuda on September 25, 2013.

The British Virgin Islands will share a group with two Caribbean national teams for the second time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, after losing 4-0 to Haiti on November 2, 2009, and 9-0 to The Bahamas on November 6, 2009.

The British Virgin Islands also shared a group with three different Caribbean national teams in the 2016 edition, suffering defeats of 3-1 against St. Kitts & Nevis on August 22, 2015, 8-0 against Trinidad & Tobago on August 25, 2015, and 2-1 against Dominica on August 26, 2015.



Anguilla vs British Virgin Islands



Anguilla and the British Virgin Islands will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For the British Virgin Islands, this will be the second time facing a Caribbean opponent, following a 13-0 loss to the Cayman Islands on November 4, 2009, in Group B of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase. That result stands as the second-heaviest defeat in the history of the British Virgin Islands in the Qualifiers, surpassed only by the 24-0 loss to Haiti on November 2, 2009.

Anguilla will play its fifth match against a Caribbean opponent in the history of the Qualifiers, holding a record of two wins, two losses, and one draw. Anguilla enters the match on a run of two consecutive games without a win (D-1 L-1), the longest winless streak in the team's history.



Grenada vs Costa Rica



Grenada and Costa Rica will meet for the third time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. Costa Rica has won both previous meetings, scoring 16 goals and conceding one.

Results:

A 9-1 victory in the Championship Phase on April 25, 2022, at Estadio Panamericano de San Cristóbal (DOM), in Group G. Costa Rica's goals were scored by **Marian Solano** twice, **Sharon Lobo**, **Jimena Jiménez**, **Tanisha Fonseca** twice, **Ashly González**, and **Sara Ramírez** twice, while **Melania Fullerton** scored for Grenada.

A 7-0 win in the 2025 edition, in Group F of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase, at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (DOM), with goals by **Lucía Paniagua** twice, **Tiara Ruíz**, **Daniela Ocampo**, **Alisha Lindo**, **Ema Azofeifa**, and **Isska Chaverri**.



Grenada vs Anguilla



Grenada and Anguilla will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For the first time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, Grenada will share a group with two Caribbean national teams (the British Virgin Islands and Anguilla), opponents it has never defeated.

For Anguilla, this will be the first time since the 2018 edition that it shares a group in the Preliminary Round with two or more Caribbean national teams, after doing so in Group B, where it recorded a 1-1 draw against The Bahamas on August 23, 2017, suffered a 2-0 loss to the Dominican Republic on August 25, 2017, and a 9-0 defeat against Puerto Rico on August 27, 2017.



Costa Rica and Cuba will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For the first time in consecutive tournaments (2025 and 2026), Costa Rica will share a group with two Caribbean national teams in the Preliminary Round of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. In the 2025 edition, Costa Rica defeated Grenada 7-0 in Group F on January 30, 2025, with goals by **Lucía Paniagua, Tiara Ruiz, Daniela Ocampo, Alisha Lindo, Emma Azofeifa, and Isska Chaverri**, and also earned a 3-0 win against the Dominican Republic on February 1, 2025, with goals by **Nubia Medina, Fabiana Alfaro, and Lucía Paniagua**.

For Cuba, this will be the fourth meeting against a Central American national team, holding one victory, a 2-0 win against Guatemala in the 2022 edition during the Championship Phase, Group H, on April 26, 2022, at Estadio Panamericano de San Cristóbal (DOM), with goals by **Ainachy Batista and Dalia Báez**, and two consecutive defeats: a 3-0 loss to El Salvador in the Final Tournament on April 28, 2022, and an 8-2 defeat against Panama in the Preliminary Round on January 31, 2025, at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez (DOM). Cuba's goals were scored by **Anelis Calvo and Olga Evelin**, while Panama's goals came from a hat trick by **Shaday Mow, braces by Yasselis Magallón and Alison Onodera, and a goal by Kelly Zapata**.
