Jamaica vs Guyana



Jamaica defeated Guyana 5-0 in their only previous meeting in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, played at the Anthony Spaulding Sports Complex in Kingston (JAM), in the preliminary phase of the Caribbean Final Four on December 1, 2011, with a hat trick from **Shadie Shirley**, along with goals by **Tiffany Robinson** and **Nicola Broderick**.

The Jamaica national team will play its third match against a Caribbean national team in the Qualifiers, having previously recorded a 5-0 victory against Guyana in the 2012 edition (December 1, 2011) and a 1-0 win against Suriname in the 2016 edition (July 19, 2015). All of those encounters took place in the Preliminary Round.

Guyana will face a Caribbean national team for the 10th time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. The team has lost all such matches and has managed to score only two goals, while conceding 69 goals (7.7 goals conceded per match), with all of those games played in the Preliminary Round.



Honduras vs Aruba



Honduras and Aruba will write their first chapter in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Honduras, the matchup against Aruba will be its third meeting against Caribbean opponents in the history of the Qualifiers. In the two previous encounters, Honduras earned two victories, kept clean sheets, and scored 19 goals, both matches played in Group C at Field 2 of the IMG Academy in Bradenton (USA).

A 7-0 win against the Turks & Caicos Islands in the 2022 edition (October 28, 2021), with four goals by **Anyeli Rodríguez**, three by **Karla Cálix**, and one by **Susan Henríquez**.

A 12-0 victory against Anguilla, also in the 2022 edition (November 1, 2021). Goals for Honduras were scored by Esther Meza, Larissa Arias twice, **Anyeli Rodríguez** three times, **Karla Cálix**, **Susan Henríquez**, **Natalie Martínez**, and **Ericka Cárdenas**.

Aruba will play its first-ever match against Central American national teams in the history of its participations in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, with Honduras becoming opponent #7.

Aruba carries a streak of six consecutive defeats. In eight matches played, the team has recorded one victory and seven losses (six consecutive, its last six matches). The only win was a 4-0 result against Curaçao in the 2010 edition (October 14, 2009), in Group A of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase.



St. Vincent & The Grenadines vs Honduras



St. Vincent & the Grenadines and Honduras will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

St. Vincent & the Grenadines, along with the Turks & Caicos Islands and the British Virgin Islands, are the only national teams that have yet to record a victory in the entire history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers across all phases. St. Vincent & the Grenadines (5/5) and the British Virgin Islands (6/6) are the only teams to have lost all of their matches.

For St. Vincent & the Grenadines, this will be the first time facing a Central American national team in the history of the Qualifiers, with Honduras becoming its sixth different opponent.

For Honduras, this will be the third time facing a Caribbean national team in Preliminary Rounds, holding a record of one win and one loss. The victory was a 1-0 win against Trinidad & Tobago in the 2025 edition on January 31, 2025, at Ato Boldon Stadium in Couva (TRI), with a goal by **Paula Ramírez Guardiola**. The defeat was a 2-1 loss to Puerto Rico in the 2024 edition on August 30, 2023, at Estadio Olímpico Félix Sánchez in Santo Domingo (DOM). Goals for Puerto Rico were scored by **Susana Roberts** and **Layrun Smith**, while **Allanys Santos** scored for Honduras.



Aruba vs Jamaica



Aruba lost both matches it played against Jamaica in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, conceding 17 goals and failing to score.

Results:

An 8-0 defeat in the 2010 edition (October 12, 2009), in Group A of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase, marking the first meeting between the two teams. Jamaica's goals were scored by **Teola Caine** four times, **Sh'nell Briscoe**, **Trudi Carter**, **Shanise Foster**, and **Davia Morrison**.

A 9-0 loss in the 2012 edition (August 25, 2011), in Group D of Round One of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase, at Estadio Panamericano de San Cristóbal (DOM). Goals for Jamaica were scored by **Shadie Shirley** three times, **Shantell Thompson** three times, **Nicole Broderick**, and **Jade Bailey**.

Aruba has lost every match it has played against Caribbean national teams (6/6), scoring only one goal and conceding 38 goals (6.3 goals per match).

Jamaica will face Caribbean national teams for the eighth time in the history of the Qualifiers, holding a record of one defeat, a 3-2 loss against Bermuda in the 2018 edition on October 18, 2017, in Group F of the Final Round of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase, and six victories, including a current run of five consecutive wins.



Jamaica vs St. Vincent & The Grenadines



Jamaica and St. Vincent & the Grenadines will meet again in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, the first time since their last encounter on August 6, 2017, when Jamaica earned a 7-0 victory in Group E of Round One of the Caribbean Preliminary Phase at Arnos Vale Stadium in Kingstown (VIN). Goals were scored by **Rochell Gray** twice, **Jaden Roberts**, **Sydney Clarke** from the penalty spot, **Jody Brown** from the penalty spot, **Monique Perrier**, and **Davia Richards**.

This will be the 17th time that the Jamaica national team faces a Caribbean opponent in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers in the Preliminary Round. Jamaica holds an unbeaten streak of 11 consecutive matches in this phase (W-9 D-2).

For St. Vincent & the Grenadines, this will be the fourth match against a Caribbean national team in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. The team has lost all three previous encounters, managing to score only one goal while conceding 13 goals (4.3 goals per match).



Aruba vs Guyana



Aruba and Guyana will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For Aruba, Guyana will be the seventh different Caribbean national team it has faced in the history of the Qualifiers.

For Guyana, this will be the sixth time facing a Caribbean opponent, and the team remains unbeaten (W-4 D-1). The run began with a 1-1 draw against Curaçao on August 17, 2017. The last four matches have all ended in victories: a 2-0 win against Anguilla on August 21, 2011; a 1-0 win against Anguilla on October 28, 2021; a 6-0 victory over the Turks & Caicos

Islands on November 1, 2021; and a 7-1 win against the Turks & Caicos Islands on January 31, 2025, with goals by **Alexaudria Chasles** twice, **Devi Sookdeo**, **Anaya Joseph**, and **Naomi Benjamin**.



Guyana vs Honduras



It will be the second time these teams meet in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers. In the first encounter, Honduras earned a 6-0 victory in the 2022 edition on October 30, at Field #2 of the IMG Academy in Bradenton (USA), in Group C of the Caribbean & Central America Preliminary Phase. Goals for Honduras were scored by **Anyelí Rodríguez** twice (one from the penalty spot), **Karla Cáliz** three times, and **Susan Henríquez**.

Guyana will play its third match against a Central American national team in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, having lost both previous encounters, with two goals scored and nine conceded. In its most recent match against Central American opponents, Guyana scored its only goals in a 2-3 defeat against Panama on January 29, 2025. The goals were scored by **Avril Pasvolsky** and **Veronica Chatta**, while Panama's goals came from **Shaday Mow**, **Karla Ovalle**, and **Yasselis Magallón**.



St. Vincent & The Grenadines vs Aruba



St. Vincent & the Grenadines and Aruba will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For St. Vincent & the Grenadines, this will be the third time facing Caribbean opponents in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, with two defeats, one goal scored, and nine goals conceded. In its most recent matches against Caribbean sides, the team suffered a 4-0 loss to the Cayman Islands on January 31, 2025, with goals by **Clara de Quintal** three times and **Olivia Ridley**, and a 5-1 defeat against Bermuda on January 29, 2025. The lone goal for St. Vincent & the Grenadines was scored by **Stephanie Hunte**, while Bermuda's goals came from **Evans Welch**, **Milan Gibbons Thomas** twice, **Avani Patton**, and **Keyandae Lightbourne**.

This will be the fourth time that the Aruba national team shares a group with two Caribbean national teams in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, losing all such matches:

Guyana vs St. Vincent & The Grenadines



Guyana and St. Vincent & the Grenadines will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

The Guyana national team will share a group with two Caribbean national teams (Jamaica and St. Vincent & the Grenadines) for the second time in the history of the Qualifiers, having previously done so in Group D of the 2018 edition, where it suffered two defeats, a 5-1 loss to Barbados on August 9, 2017, and an 8-0 defeat against Cuba on August 13, 2017.

For St. Vincent & the Grenadines, Guyana will become the eighth different Caribbean national team it has faced in the history of the Qualifiers. This will mark the first time in the history of the competition that St. Vincent & the Grenadines faces three different national teams for the first time in a single edition (Honduras, Aruba, and Guyana).



Honduras vs Jamaica



Honduras and Jamaica will meet for the first time in the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers.

For the first time in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers, Honduras will share a group with two Caribbean national teams, and it will also mark the first time the Honduran side faces two different Caribbean opponents in a Preliminary Round (Jamaica and St. Vincent & the Grenadines).

For Jamaica, this will be the fourth time facing a Central American national team in the history of the Concacaf Women's Under-17 Qualifiers in the Preliminary Round. Jamaica has yet to record a victory (L-2 D-1), with its two defeats coming in its most recent matches: a 1-0 loss to Panama on August 27, 2023, with the lone goal scored by **Analía Arosemena**, and a 2-1 defeat against Nicaragua on February 1, 2025. Jamaica's goal was scored by **Ella Provost-Heron**, while **Olivia Flores** and **Mitzy Canales** scored for Nicaragua.
